



The Leaves They Are a-Changin'

With the autumnal equinox in late September, foliage season has officially begun across much of the United States.

Why do leaves change colors? Did you know that fall's vivid colors are actually hidden underneath summer's green? The main reason for the color change is not autumn's chilly weather, but light—or rather, the lack of it. The green color of leaves disappears when photosynthesis (from sunlight) slows down, and the chlorophyll breaks down. Trees with a lot of direct sunlight will produce red leaves, while other trees may turn yellow, orange, or brown.

October 1 marks the start of Yom Kippur at sundown.

October 9 is Leif Eriksson Day.

October 13 a busy day, with three holidays packed into it: *Canadian Thanksgiving*. This holiday shares many similarities with its American equivalent. However, there are a number of things that set the Canadian Thanksgiving apart!

Columbus Day (U.S.), a federal holiday, is observed on the second Monday in October. It was on October 12, 1492, that Christopher Columbus landed on a small island in the Bahamas, convinced that he had reached Asia. Read more about Columbus Day.

Indigenous Peoples' Day (U.S.)—a holiday that celebrates the history and cultures of indigenous peoples native to what is today the United States. October Astronomy & the Moon

October's full Moon is know as the Harvest Moon and arrives on Monday, October 6^{th,} this full Moon is always near the autumnal equinox AND it appears low and large on the horizon. This year, it's the first Supermoon! The peak illumination should appear around 10:47pm central time.

This is the first of 3 consecutive supermoons of the year-so it will appear bigger and brighter than the full Moon we have seen thus far!

Health Article: Breast Cancer & Seniors: What to know

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and while a lot of attention is given to the importance of early detection and women getting mammograms beginning at age 40, there is less emphasis on older adults. In reality, this population is at increased risk & should continue to be vigilant about breast health.

According to the Surveillance Epidemiology and End Results registry, "The median age of a breast cancer diagnosis is 62 and nearly 20 percent of women diagnosed are over the age of 75." Researchers also predict that cancer diagnoses in women ages 70 to 84 will continue to increase.

The good news is that breast cancer is still treatable – and survivable – for seniors. Whereas radical mastectomies were once commonplace, with advancements in research and treatment, they are now fairly rare with other options proving effective. More studies are being conducted to better understand cancer development and treatment effects on older adults. It is important that the patient's age and functional ability be taken into consideration when undergoing chemotherapy treatment to reduce risk of potential toxicities and minimize the impact on their quality of life.

Breast Cancer Signs and Symptoms

Early detection is still key when it comes to effectively treating breast cancer. Women should continue to receive annual or biennial mammograms to monitor breast health and detect any changes. Unfortunately, doctors have found that seniors tend to become less consistent with yearly breast screenings. Monthly self-exams are also recommended, as well as paying attention to warning signs that may indicate breast cancer.

A lump in the breast or underarm Visible changes in breast size or shape Redness or pitting of the skin Bloody discharge from the nipple

Women should also know common risk factors for breast cancer such as:

Over 50 years old Menarche beginning before age 12 Menopause beginning after age 50 No pregnancy or pregnancy after age 30 Long-term oral contraceptive use Dense breast tissue
